SENATE AMENDMENT "C" to H.P. 1262, L.D. 1810, Bill, "An Act To Enact the Informed Growth Act"

Amend the bill by adding before the summary the following:

§4371. Exemption

The provisions of this subchapter do not apply to a municipality that has adopted a municipalwide zoning ordinance based on a comprehensive plan pursuant to this chapter.

SUMMARY

This amendment provides an exemption from the Informed Growth Act, which is enacted in the bill, for a municipality that has adopted a zoning ordinance based on the comprehensive plan pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, chapter 187.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment provides an exemption from the Informed Growth Act for certain municipalities who have adopted a municipal-wide zoning ordinance based on their comprehensive plan. This exemption may reduce the number of times the State Planning Office will be involved in the permitting process proposed in the bill. This change will result in minor savings to the State Planning Office. As amended, the bill is still a funded mandate to other municipalities.
