18 19	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

"Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund contributions" means the money payments required by this section to be made into the Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund by an employer as a percentage of the employer's taxable payroll based on the Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund predetermined yield in effect for that Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund rate year.
25 26 27	B. "Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund planned yield" means the percentage of wages, as defined in section 1043, subsection 19, equal to .02% of the contributions of each contributing employer subject to this chapter.
28 29 30 31 32	C. "Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund predetermined yield" means the amount determined by multiplying the ratio of total wages to taxable wages, as defined by section 1221, subsection 6, paragraph L, by the Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund planned yield. The Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund predetermined yield is rounded to the nearest .01%.

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- D. "Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund rate year" has the same meaning as "rate year" under section 1221, subsection 6, paragraph F.
- 2. Established. The Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund, referred to in this section as "the fund," is established as a special fund in the State Treasury. All receipts, including interest, fines and penalties collected from Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund contributions, must be paid into the fund. Income from investment of the fund must be deposited to the credit of the fund. All money in the fund must be deposited, administered and disbursed in the same manner and under the same conditions and requirements as are provided by law for other special funds.
- 10 The money in the fund must be administered by the commissioner exclusively for the 11 purposes of chapter 25, subchapter 5 and for the costs of administering the fund.
- 3. Unencumbered balances. Any unencumbered balance in the fund remaining at the end of any fiscal year remains in the fund and may not be made available for 14 expenditure without specific legislative approval.
  - 4. No supplantation. Allocations from the fund must be used to supplement, not supplant, federal or state funds received by the Department of Labor, by a local board or by organizations that deliver workforce investment services through the career center provided by the department.
- 19 5. Employers liable for Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund contribution. Each 20 employer, as defined in section 1043, subsection 9, other than an employer liable for a payment in lieu of a contribution, shall pay a Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund 21 22 contribution.
- 23 Beginning January 1, 2008, Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund contributions are 24 payable in the same manner as described under section 1221, subsection 1 and in 25 accordance with section 1221, subsection 4-A.
- 26 6. Receipts. All receipts collected from Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund 27 contributions, including interest, fines and penalties on contributions not paid when due, must be paid into the fund. 28
- 29 7. Experience rating records. Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund contributions 30 may not be credited to an employer's experience rating record as described in section 31 1221, subsection 3.
- 32 8. Relationship to unemployment insurance contributions. Competitive Skills 33 Scholarship Fund contributions may not be considered as part of the employer's unemployment insurance contribution rate pursuant to section 1221. Unemployment 34 35 insurance contributions for all employers subject to the contribution provisions of this chapter must be reduced by a percentage equal to the total Competitive Skills Scholarship 36 Fund contribution assessment as in section 1221, subsection 4-A. Exceptions pertaining 37 38 to new employer rates and contribution rate category 20 are described in section 1221, 39 subsection 4-A, paragraphs A and B.
- 9. Other provisions of this chapter. All provisions of this chapter and rules 40 adopted under this chapter regarding payments, time limits, dates of payment, reports, 41 interest and penalties on amounts not paid by employers when due, fines, liens and 42

10 SUMMARY

This amendment changes the name of the training fund to the Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund and the name of the program to the Competitive Skills Scholarship Program. The title of the bill is replaced to reflect these name changes. The amendment provides that unencumbered balances in the Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund remain in the fund and do not lapse to the General Fund. The amendment also provides that Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund dollars must be used to supplement, and not supplant, other state or local funds that are used to deliver workforce investment services through Maine's CareerCenters. The amendment includes technical changes to make the bill internally consistent and clarifies that an individual career plan is developed in cooperation with the participant and that it must, to the maximum extent feasible, reflect the preferences of the participant, provided that the individual career plan remains within the confines of the goals of the program. The amendment also clarifies that participants must be given a description of the program as well as a list of services and supports available through the program. The amendment also permits the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Revenue Services to disclose to designated employees of the Department of Labor information necessary to administer the contributions to the Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund. It also adds an appropriations and allocations section.

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This legislation includes initiatives to improve the State's employment security programs.

First, the bill creates the Competitive Skills Scholarship Program to provide access to education, training and support to prepare career center clients for high-wage jobs in industries with significant demand for skilled labor. The program is funded by employer contributions based on a predetermined yield. The Department of Labor estimates total contributions to the Competitive Skills Scholarship Fund to be \$1.35 million in fiscal year 2007-08 and \$2.95 million in fiscal year 2008-09. Employer contributions to the Employment Security Trust Fund are reduced by the same amount so that the net impact of this initiative to employers is zero. This bill also allocates personal services and all other resources to the Competitive Skills Scholarship Program to reflect the services that will be provided by current employees within the Department of Labor.

This legislation also lowers the benefit reserve cap on the Unemployment Trust Fund from 21 months to 18 months which will reduce unemployment contributions for all employers by \$16.9 million in fiscal year 2007-08 and \$34.3 million in fiscal year 2008-09.

This bill includes Other Fund allocations of \$3,500,000 in fiscal year 2007-08 and \$5,000,000 in fiscal year 2008-05 to the Unemployment Compensation Benefit Account within the Department of Labor for the cost associated with eliminating the pension offset against unemployment benefits for persons who receive social security or any other pension provided the person contributed at least 50% of the contributions to that pension. The cost increase in this bill is not expected to impact the unemployment contributions schedule until after the 2011 rate year. The State and all other direct reimbursement employers will be required to repay the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund for the additional benefit payments.

This legislation also includes Other Fund allocations of \$3,000,000 in fiscal year 2008-09 to the Unemployment Compensation Benefit Account for the costs associated with eliminating the September 30, 2008 sunset of the provision that allows a person to collect unemployment benefits if that person is able and available for part-time work. Eliminating the sunset will increase benefits paid from the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund beginning in fiscal year 2008-09.

Finally, this bill authorizes the use of \$5.2 million of Reed Act funds to make certain technological upgrades and improvements to the unemployment insurance and employment services computer systems as well as improvements to the labor market information services computer systems as they relate to the analysis of unemployment and employment data. It provides that a portion of these funds will be used for the administrative costs associated with helping unemployment benefit recipients return to work more quickly.
