COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1327, L.D. 1895

Amend the bill in section 13 in §1210-C in the last line (page 10, line 25 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "<u>practices.</u>" the following: '<u>Only a county that establishes</u> or participates as a member of a criminal justice planning committee under Title 30-A, section 1671 may apply for grants distributed pursuant to this section.'

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SUMMARY

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18 This amendment clarifies that counties are not mandated to form criminal justice 19 planning committees; however, when grants are available under the Community 20 Corrections Incentive Fund, only those counties who have formed or have become part of a planning committee will be eligible to apply for such grants. The amendment also 21 22 clarifies that, regardless of how a criminal justice planning committee is established or 23 formed, a county may also collaborate with another county or counties with which it has not formed a planning committee in order to work together to seek grants or establish 24 25 community corrections programs or initiatives. The amendment adds the Commissioner of Public Safety to the membership of the State Sentencing and Corrections Practices 26 Coordinating Council and requires that the representative of a statewide municipal 27 28 association on the council be nominated by the association and then appointed by the 29 Governor. Finally, the amendment replaces the appropriations and allocations section in 30 the bill for the Community Corrections Incentive Fund.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill creates a nonlapsing Community Corrections Incentive Fund to be administered by the Department of Corrections. Any funds received for this purpose will be awarded to counties as competitive grants to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the state's correctional system. The administrative costs associated with this legislation can be absorbed by the Department of Corrections utilizing existing budgeted resources. Included in the bill is a base allocation of \$500 to establish an Other Special Revenue Funds account.
