An Act To Establish the Acquired Brain Injury Advisory Council

Reported by Senator BRANNIGAN of Cumberland for the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services pursuant to Joint Order 2006, S.P. 699.

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CHAPTER 19

ADVISORY COUNCILS

10 §19001. Acquired Brain Injury Advisory Council

11 <u>1. Council established.</u> The Acquired Brain Injury Advisory Council referred to in 12 this section as "the council," is established to provide independent oversight and advice 13 and to make recommendations to the commissioner, the Director of the Office of Adults 14 with Cognitive and Physical Disability Services within the department, the Director of the 15 Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention within the department and the Director 16 of the Office of MaineCare Services within the department.

- 17 **2.** Duties. The council shall:
- 18 A. Identify issues related to brain injury, including prevention and the needs of
 19 individuals with disabilities due to brain injuries and the needs of their families;
- B. Recommend methods that will enhance health and well-being, promote
 independence and self-sufficiency, protect and care for those at risk and provide
 effective and efficient methods of prevention, service and support;

C. Seek information from the broadest range of stakeholders, including persons with
 brain injuries, their families, rehabilitation experts, providers of services and the
 public, and hold at least 2 public hearings annually, in different regions of the State,
 to generate input on unmet needs;

- D. Review the status and effectiveness of the array of brain injury programs, services
 and prevention efforts provided in this State and recommend to the commissioner
 priorities and criteria for disbursement of available appropriations; and
- 30 <u>E. Meet at least 4 times per year and by January 15th of each year submit a report of</u>
 31 <u>its activities and recommendations to the commissioner and to the Legislature.</u>

32 <u>3. Administrative support.</u> The manager of brain injury services in the Office of
 33 Adults with Cognitive and Physical Disability Services within the department shall
 34 provide administrative support to the council.

- <u>4. Membership.</u> The commissioner shall appoint 16 persons to serve as members of
 the council and shall annually appoint one person to serve as chair. Members serve 2-year
 terms. Members must represent the following persons and interests:
- A. Two members with acquired brain injuries must represent persons with acquired
 brain injuries;
- 6 B. Two members must represent families of persons with acquired brain injuries;
- 7 <u>C. Two members must represent advocates for persons with acquired brain injuries;</u>
- B. Five members must represent providers of services to persons with acquired brain
 injuries; and

10 E. Five members must represent state agencies with expertise in the areas of 11 education, employment, prevention of brain injuries, homelessness, corrections and 12 services to veterans. Members of the council who represent state agencies serve ex 13 officio, without the right to vote, and shall provide data, information and expertise to 14 the council.

15 5. Expenses. Members of the council serve without compensation but are entitled to 16 reimbursement of reasonable expenses for attending meetings of and serving on the 17 council.

18 Sec. 3. Staggered terms. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 19 34-B, section 19001, subsection 4, 8 of the initial members appointed to the Acquired 20 Brain Injury Advisory Council serve 2-year terms and 8 serve 3-year terms.

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SUMMARY

This bill establishes the Acquired Brain Injury Advisory Council to provide oversight and advice and to make recommendations to the Commissioner of Health and Human Services and the Director of the Office of Adults with Cognitive and Physical Disability Services, the Director of the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention and the Director of the Office of MaineCare Services within the Department of Health and Human Services.
