An Act To Clarify the Election of Municipal Charter Commission Members

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 203.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §2103, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 737, Pt. A, §2
and Pt. C, §106 and amended by PL 1989, c. 6; c. 9, §2; and c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is
further amended to read:

- 5 A. Voter members shall <u>must</u> be elected by one of the following methods:
- 6 (1) Six voter members shall <u>must</u> be elected in the same manner as the 7 municipal officers, except that they must be elected at-large and without party 8 designations; or
- 9 (2) One voter shall <u>member must</u> be elected from each voting district or ward in 10 the same manner as municipal officers, except that they must be elected without 11 party designation-<u>; or</u>
- 12 (3) In municipalities that have municipal officers elected both at-large and by 13 district, the number of voter members must be the same as the number of 14 municipal officers on the board or council of that municipality and must be 15 elected in the same manner as the municipal officers, except that they must be 16 elected without party designation.

17 Election of voter members may be held either at the same municipal election as the referendum for the charter commission, but must be held within 90 days of the 18 19 referendum election or at the next scheduled regular or special municipal or state election that is at least 90 days after the referendum authorizing the charter 20 commission. The names of the candidates on the ballot shall must be arranged 21 22 alphabetically by last name. If the elections are held at the same time, the names of 23 the candidates shall must appear immediately below the question relating to the charter commission. 24

SUMMARY

This bill amends the procedure for the election of members to a municipal charter commission. Specifically, it would give the municipality the option to either include the election of voter members on the same ballot as the question authorizing the commission or have members elected no later than the first regular or special municipal or state election that occurs at least 90 days after the vote authorizing the charter commission.

This bill also provides for a third method for electing voter members on a charter commission for a municipality that has municipal officers elected both at-large and by district. That number would be equal to the total number of elected municipal officers on the board or council of that municipality.
