1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not
2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

3 **Whereas,** the need to keep Store Road open is time-sensitive, and this issue must be
4 resolved before the end of the legislative session; and

5 **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within
6 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as
7 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
8 therefore, be it

9 **Sec. 1. County road kept open. Resolved:** That the county commissioners of
10 Somerset County shall keep Store Road, a county road in Rockwood, opened and
11 maintained for use throughout the year.

12 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this
13 legislation takes effect when approved.

15 This resolve directs the county commissioners of Somerset County to keep Store
16 Road in Rockwood, Somerset County open throughout the year.
