The bureau may provide a grant of emergency assistance not to exceed \$500 \$5,000 to a veteran who suffers an emergency, such as the loss of that veteran's home to fire, flood or hurricane, that is not fully compensable by insurance; illness or the illness of an immediate family member; or a similar emergency. No more than \$1,000 \$10,000 in emergency assistance may be provided to a veteran in any 12-month period. For the purposes of this paragraph, "veteran" has the same meaning as "eligible veteran" in section 504, subsection 4, paragraph A-1.

the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management, Bureau of Maine

Veterans' Services to a veteran who suffers an emergency, such as the loss of that

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- veteran's home to fire, flood or hurricane, that is not fully compensable by insurance, or an illness or the illness of an immediate family member or similar emergency. It also provides an appropriation of \$250,000 to fund the grants.
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
