Resolve, Establishing the Commission To Review the Accountability of State Cultural Agencies

- 1 Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 2
- 3 Whereas, this resolve establishes the Commission To Review the Accountability of State Cultural Agencies; and 4
- 5 Whereas, the commission is required to begin its work in June 2008; and
- 6 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 8 therefore, be it
- 10 Sec. 1. Study commission established. Resolved: That the Commission To Review the Accountability of State Cultural Agencies, referred to in this resolve as "the 11 commission," is established; and be it further 12
- 13 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 14 9 members appointed as follows:
- 15 1. Three Senators, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 16 2. Four members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the 17 House; and
- 18 3. The following persons appointed as ex officio voting members:
- 19 A. The Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services; and
- B. The chair of the Maine State Cultural Affairs Council; and be it further 20
- Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate 21 chair and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the 22 23 commission; and be it further
- 24 Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this 25 resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative 26 Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment 27 28 of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission,
- which must be no later than June 15, 2008; and be it further 29
- 30 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall review existing
- accountability for the State's cultural agencies and develop strategies to increase 31 32
- accountability. For purposes of this section, "the State's cultural agencies" means the
- Maine State Museum, the Maine State Library, the Maine State Archives, the Maine Arts 33
- Commission, the Maine Historic Preservation Commission, the Maine Humanities 34
- 35 Council and the Maine Historical Society; and be it further

2	necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further
3	Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That, no later than November 5, 2008, the
4	commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations,
5	including suggested legislation, for presentation to the First Regular Session of the 124th
6	Legislature. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over
7	education and cultural affairs is authorized to introduce a bill related to the subject matter
8	of the report to the First Regular Session of the 124th Legislature upon receipt of the
9	report.
10	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this
11	legislation takes effect when approved.
