HOUSE AMENDMENT *A* to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1417,
L.D. 2033, "Resolve, Directing the Department of Health and Human Services To Adopt
Rules Governing the Use of Lakes by Licensed Child Care Facilities "

Amend the amendment by striking out the substitute title and replacing it with the
following:

**'Resolve, Directing the Department of Health and Human Services To Adopt
Rules Governing Water Activities Offered by Licensed Child Care Facilities'**

Amend the amendment in section 1 in the last line (page 2, line 5 in amendment) by
striking out the following: "." and inserting the following: '; and be it further'

Amend the amendment by inserting after section 1 the following:

'Sec. 2. Notice regarding water activities. Resolved: That the Department of
Health and Human Services shall adopt rules that require a family child care provider or
child care facility that offers water activities without a lifeguard on duty to provide
written notice to the parent or guardian of every child who participates in water activities
that there will not be a lifeguard on duty.

Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in the
Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.'


