ı	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §1013 is enacted to read:
3	§1013. Use of liquid calcium chloride prohibited
4 5	The use of liquid calcium chloride on any state highways, state aid highways or town ways is prohibited for preventing snow from encumbering the highways or town ways.
6	SUMMARY
7 8	This bill bans the use of liquid calcium chloride on all roads in the State for snow removal.
