17 18 19 20 21	Notwithstanding section 10001, subsection 28 and Title 29-A, section 552, a person licensed to guide hunters under this chapter may employ the services of a person not licensed as a guide to transport hunters along a public or private road in a motor vehicle for the sole purpose of delivering those hunters to a predetermined destination prior to or at the conclusion of the time those hunters are engaged in hunting. For purposes of this section, "motor vehicle" does not include a snowmobile or an all-terrain vehicle.
23	1. Prohibition. A person, while transporting hunters pursuant to this section, may
24	not:
25	A. Engage in hunting:
26 27	B. Transport hunting equipment for that person's own use unless that hunting equipment is fastened in a case:

3 4 5 6	A. A person who violates subsection 1 commits a Class E crime. When a person is convicted of violating subsection 1, the guide employing that person must be issued a warning by a law enforcement officer, as defined in Title 25, section 2801-A, subsection 5.
7 8 9 10	B. A person licensed as a guide who receives 3 or more warnings pursuant to paragraph A within a 5-year period commits a civil violation for which a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$500 may be adjudged. The commissioner may suspend the guide license of a person adjudicated of a violation of this paragraph for a period of up to one year.
12 13 14	C. A person licensed as a guide who violates paragraph B after having been adjudicated as having committed 3 or more civil violations under this Part within a 5-year period commits a Class E crime.
15	3. Repeal. This section is repealed July 31, 2010.
16	SUMMARY
17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25	This amendment authorizes a person licensed as a guide to employ the services of a person not licensed as a guide to transport hunters along a public or private road in a motor vehicle for the sole purpose of delivering those hunters to a predetermined destination prior to or at the conclusion of the time those hunters are engaged in hunting. It also prohibits the unlicensed person from hunting or participating in hunting-related activities while transporting hunters for a guide. This amendment also provides liability for a guide when there are 3 or more violations of the transportation provision by a person employed by that guide within a 5-year period. The provisions of the amendment are repealed July 31, 2010.
