- 4 1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the 5 following terms have the following meanings.
- 6 A. "Personally identifiable information" means one or more of the following specific 7 unique identifiers when combined with an individual's name:
- 8 (1) Social security number:
- 9 (2) Driver's license number or state identification card number:
- 10 (3) Financial institution account number and credit, debit or charge card number; 11 and
- 12 (4) Date of birth.
- 13 B. "Preparer" means the person or entity that creates, drafts, edits, revises or last 14 changes the documents that are recorded with the register of deeds.
- 15 Inclusion of personally identifiable information. Notwithstanding any 16 provision of law to the contrary, the preparer of a document may not include an 17 individual's personally identifiable information in a document that is prepared and 18 presented for recording in the registry office. This subsection does not apply to 19 documents that were executed by an individual prior to the effective date of this 20 subsection.
- 3. Redaction on registry's website. If a document that includes an individual's 22 personally identifiable information was recorded with the register of deeds prior to the effective date of this subsection and is available on the registry's publicly accessible 24 website, the individual may request that the register of deeds redact that personally 25 identifiable information from the website record. The register shall establish a procedure by which individuals make such requests at no fee to the requesting individual. The 26 register shall comply with an individual's request to redact personally identifiable 28 information.
- 29 4. Liability of preparer. A preparer who violates subsection 2 is liable to the individual whose personally identifiable information appears in the recorded public 30 document for damages of up to \$500 for each act of recording. 31
- 32 5. Liability of register of deeds. The register of deeds is not liable for any claims 33 arising from a violation of this section.
- 34 6. Application. This section does not apply to federal tax liens or other documents 35 required by federal law to contain personally identifiable information that are filed or recorded in the registry office. 36

This bill prohibits the preparer of documents from including an individual's personally identifiable information in a document recorded in the registry of deeds.
