SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1497, L.D. 2111, Bill, "An Act To Secure the Sites Necessary for the Statewide Radio and Network System"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 19-B in the last line (page 1, line 7 in L.D.) by striking out the following: ";" and inserting in its place the following: 'This subsection is repealed 5 years after the effective date of this subsection;'

This amendment adds language to the bill that repeals the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1742, subsection 19-B 5 years after the subsection takes effect.
