COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1499, L.D. 2113, Bill, "An Act To Implement the Recommendations of the Committee To Study the Prison Industries Program"

Amend the bill in section 2 in §3002-B in subsection 3 in paragraph C in the last line (page 2, line 5 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "; and" and inserting the following:

Amend the bill in section 2 in §3002-B in subsection 3 in paragraph D in the last line (page 2, line 8 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "1761(2006)." and inserting the following: '1761(2006); and'

Amend the bill in section 2 in §3002-B in subsection 3 by inserting after paragraph D the following:

'E. Reviewing the cost-benefit ratio of the prison industries programs.'

SUMMARY

This amendment adds to the duties of the Prison Industries Advisory Council the duty to review the cost-benefit ratio of the prison industries programs.
