5 SUMMARY

The bill, as amended by Committee Amendment "B," eliminates the requirement that notification of rulemaking relating to the status of a shellfish area be published in a newspaper. This amendment directs that the resulting savings be transferred to the Shellfish Fund, which is established for the management, enforcement, restoration, development and conservation of shellfish and mussels in the intertidal zone or coastal waters, and allocates those funds for funding overtime for water quality staff and training volunteers in the water quality program.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment specifies that the savings recognized by not having to publish the status of shellfish areas in newspapers be transferred into the Shellfish Fund and results in a reduction of cost savings to the General Fund of \$25,000 in fiscal year 2008-09 and a corresponding increase to Other Special Revenue Funds in the Department of Marine Resources of \$25,000 in fiscal year 2008-09.
