Amend the bill in Part B by striking out all of section 10 and inserting the following:

8 'Sec. B-10. Referendum for ratification; submission at election; form of 9 question; effective date. This Part must be submitted to the legal voters of the State at 10 a statewide election held in the month of November following the passage of this Act. 11 The municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, 12 towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide 13 election, to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Part by voting on the following 14 question:

"Do you favor a \$3,400,000 bond issue to support drinking water
programs, to support the construction of clean water treatment facilities
and to leverage \$17,000,000 in other funds?"

18 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question 19 and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and 20 declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of 21 22 State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall 23 review the returns. If a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of this Part, the 24 Governor shall proclaim the result without delay and this Part becomes effective 30 days 25 after the date of the proclamation.

The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this Part necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

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SUMMARY

This amendment removes Part A of the bill, which proposed to amend the laws pertaining to storm water management. The amendment also increases the bond issue for the drinking water revolving loan fund to \$1,700,000 and it increases the bond issue for the clean water treatment facility revolving loan fund to \$1,700,000. It also increases the match amount relating to each fund from \$4,250,000 to \$8,500,000.
