## An Act To Correct the Law Regarding Portability of Pension Benefits for Law Enforcement Officers and Firefighters

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 203.

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17656, sub-§1, ¶D, as enacted by PL 2005, c. 636, Pt. B, §1, is
amended to read:

4 D. If the plan from which the member is transferring and the plan to which the 5 member is transferring are both plans described in section 286 M, subsection 3, 6 paragraph A, subparagraph (3), the member Notwithstanding subsection 1, a member 7 of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System who is a law enforcement officer 8 as defined in Title 25, section 2801-A, subsection 5, or a state firefighter, whose 9 previous membership was based upon employment as a municipal firefighter as defined in section 286-M, a law enforcement officer or a state firefighter may elect to 10 make the contribution necessary to include all or part of the member's creditable 11 service and earnable compensation from the prior plan in the new plan. 12 The retirement system shall establish procedures for determining the contribution 13 14 necessary for such a member to carry forward all or part of the creditable service and 15 earnable compensation from a prior plan or plans. For purposes of this paragraph, "state firefighter" means a person employed by the State with the primary 16 responsibility of aiding in the extinguishment of fires and includes a member of 17 18 emergency medical services line personnel as defined in section 286-M, subsection 2, 19 paragraph H.

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §18253, sub-§1, ¶E, as enacted by PL 2005, c. 636, Pt. B, §2, is
amended to read:

22 If the plan from which the member is transferring and the plan to which the E. 23 member is transferring are both plans described in section 286 M, subsection 3, 24 paragraph A, subparagraph (3), the member Notwithstanding subsection 1, a member 25 of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System who is a law enforcement officer as defined in Title 25, section 2801-A, subsection 5, or a municipal firefighter as 26 defined in section 286-M, whose previous membership was based upon employment 27 as a law enforcement officer, a state firefighter or a municipal firefighter, and whose 28 service retirement benefits are not otherwise governed by section 18801, subsection 29 30 1, paragraph A, subparagraph 2 may elect to make the contribution necessary to 31 include all or part of the member's creditable service and earnable compensation from 32 the prior plan in the new plan. The retirement system shall establish procedures for 33 determining the contribution necessary for such a member to carry forward all or part 34 of the creditable service and earnable compensation from a prior plan or plans. For 35 purposes of this paragraph, "state firefighter" means a person employed by the State with the primary responsibility of aiding in the extinguishment of fires and includes a 36 member of emergency medical services line personnel as defined in section 286-M, 37 38 subsection 2, paragraph H.

#### SUMMARY

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40 This bill implements the intent of PL 2005, chapter 636, Part B. It allows law 41 enforcement officers and firefighters to carry service credit and compensation from a

prior retirement plan to a new retirement plan within the Maine Public Employees Retirement System as long as they pay the additional cost of doing so. 1

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
