5	§1071. Definitions		
6 7	As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.		
8 9 10	1. Advisory committee. "Advisory committee" means the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices.		
11 12	2. Program. "Program" means the Universal Childhood Immunization Program established in section 1072.		
13	§1072. Universal Childhood Immunization Program		
14 15	The Universal Childhood Immunization Program is established in accordance with this section.		
16 17 18 19 20	1. Vaccines included. The department shall include in the program those vaccines for childhood immunizations recommended by the advisory committee and designated for coverage by the federal Vaccines for Children Program. The department shall allow each health care provider participating in the program to select vaccines from a list of all vaccines that:		
21	A. Are approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration;		
22	B. Are recommended by the advisory committee; and		
23 24	C. Are made available under contract with the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.		
25	§1073. Childhood Immunization Account		
26 27 28 29	The Childhood Immunization Account is established as a dedicated account within the department. The department shall use all money in the account to effectuate the provisions of the program. All money received under section 1074 must be deposited in the account.		
30 31 32 33 34	Sec. 2. Rulemaking; Commissioner of Health and Human Services. The Commissioner of Health and Human Services shall adopt rules to implement the Universal Childhood Immunization Program established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 1072. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

14 SUMMARY

15 This bill establishes the Universal Childhood Immunization Program within the Department of Health and Human Services. The department is directed to include in the 16 program those vaccines for childhood immunizations recommended by the United States 17 18 Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 19 Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices and designated for coverage by the federal Vaccines for Children Program. The department is directed to annually determine 20 21 the dollar amount necessary to purchase, store, distribute and provide quality assurance 22 for vaccines for routine immunizations, in accordance with the recommendations of the 23 advisory committee, and to communicate this annual determination to the Superintendent 24 of Insurance. The bill establishes a dedicated account to effectuate the provisions of the 25 program. The bill provides funds for the program from the Fund for a Healthy Maine.
