The commission may not grant approval to a telephone utility under this subsection unless the telephone utility submits evidence satisfactory to the commission that the telephone utility has at least \$250,000 in fixed assets in this State or the telephone utility purchases and maintains a surety bond satisfactory to the commission in the amount of \$250,000 to ensure the telephone utility has the financial ability to meet its obligations under this Title. This paragraph does no apply to a telephone utility authorized to provide telephone service in this State or the effective date of this paragraph.'

24 25 26	Under current law, a telephone utility may not furnish service in any municipality in which another telephone utility is furnishing services without the approval of the Public Utilities Commission.
