11 --- SUMMARY

12 This amendment retains those portions of the bill that give the community service 13 networks the responsibility of providing consolidated mental health crisis services for 14 children and adults, beginning March 1, 2009, through a memorandum of understanding among providers of mental health services in the network that includes provisions to 15 ensure coordination, eliminate duplication and provide a minimum level of crisis services 16 17 established by the Department of Health and Human Services and provides funding for 18 hospital-based physicians in order to protect access to health care. Rather than updating 19 the base year for the hospital tax, this amendment reduces funding by managing enrollment in the childless adult waiver program and maximizing the use of the federal 20 21 allocation in the qualified individual program and other efficiencies in the MaineCare 22 program.
