16 17 18	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13004, sub-§2-A , as enacted by PL 1983, c. 470, §11 and amended by PL 1999, c. 547, Pt. B, §78 and affected by §80, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
19	2-A. Confidentiality. The provisions of this subsection govern confidentiality.
20	A. Complaints and responses pursuant to section 13020 and any other information or
21	materials that may result in an action to deny, revoke or suspend certification are
22 23	<u>confidential, except when submitted in court proceedings to revoke or suspend</u> certification.
24	B. If a complaint under section 13020 is based upon a criminal conviction or upon
25	information that has become generally known to the public, the department may
26	comment publicly on the existence and status of the complaint but shall otherwise
27	preserve confidentiality in accordance with this subsection.
28	C. Except for information designated confidential under section 6102 or section
29 30	6103, the department may release relevant information that is designated confidential under paragraph A to:
31	(1) A national association of state directors of teacher education and certification
32	to which the State belongs;
33	(2) Other public authorities that are considering reciprocal action or that are
34	investigating a person's certification in another jurisdiction; or
35	(3) Law enforcement agencies in aid of their investigations.

HOUSE AMENDMENT "H" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 912, L.D. 2291

D. This subsection may not prohibit the department from using or releasing relevant information as necessary:

(1) To investigate or prosecute complaints; or

(2) To report, curtail or prevent criminal conduct.

E. The department may publish and release as public information statistical summaries of complaints and dispositions as long as the release of such information does not jeopardize the confidentiality of individually identifiable information.' '

SUMMARY

9 This amendment accomplishes the following.

10 It permits access to confidential information on denials, revocations and 1. suspensions of teacher certification to the extent that the information is needed by a 11 12 national association of state directors of teacher education and certification, in aid of an 13 investigation by other jurisdictions investigating qualifications for certification or considering reciprocal disciplinary action or by law enforcement agencies in aid of an 14 15 investigation.

16 2. It authorizes the Department of Education to comment publicly on the existence and status of a complaint when the complaint is based on a criminal conviction or upon 17 18 information that has become generally known to the public.

19 3. It allows the Department of Education to use relevant information to investigate or 20 prosecute complaints or to report, curtail or prevent criminal conduct.

21 4. It authorizes the Department of Education to disseminate as public information 22 statistical summaries of complaints and dispositions as long as the dissemination does not 23 jeopardize the confidentiality of individually identifiable information.
