In conducting this analysis, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall review the apparent conflict between the confidentiality requirements placed on information received by the Commissioner of Education as set forth in the criminal history record check provisions of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 6103 and the provisions set forth in Title 22, section 4011-A that require persons, when acting in a professional capacity, to report their knowledge or reasonable suspicions of the abuse or neglect of a child to the Department of Health and Human Services. The Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall submit a report with findings to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs by November 5, 2008.
