SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 44, L.D. 51, Bill, "An Act To Allow Military Personnel Living in Maine To Benefit under the Maine Resident Homestead Property Tax Exemption"

Amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the emergency preamble the following:


**Mandate preamble.** This measure requires one or more local units of government to expand or modify activities so as to necessitate additional expenditures from local revenues but does not provide funding for at least 90% of those expenditures. Pursuant to the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 21, 2/3 of all of the members elected to each House have determined it necessary to enact this measure.

#### State Mandates

##### Required Activity

Requiring municipalities to engage in additional administrative and clerical functions related to inclusion of additional military personnel in the Maine Resident Homestead Property Tax Exemption program may be a mandate under the Constitution of Maine.

##### Unit Affected

Municipality

##### Local Cost

Insignificant statewide

The required local activities in this bill may represent a State mandate pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. Pursuant to the Mandate Preamble added by this amendment, the State is exempted from funding at least 90% of the additional local costs.
