Sec. 1. 12 MIRSA §10001, sub-§28, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2 and affected by c. 614, §9, is amended to read:

28. Guide. "Guide" means a person who receives any form of remuneration for that person's services in accompanying or assisting a <u>another</u> person in the fields, <u>or</u> forests or on the waters or ice within the jurisdiction of the State while <u>who is engaging in</u> <u>recreational activities</u>, <u>including</u>, <u>but not limited to</u>, hunting, fishing, trapping, boating, snowmobiling or camping at a primitive camping area.

SUMMARY

10 This bill clarifies the definition of "guide" to provide consistency in the laws 11 governing a guide license for services provided for a fee to another for recreational 12 activities taking place on lands or waters within the State's jurisdiction.
