SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 135, L.D. 156, Bill, "An Act To Protect Consumers from the Unlicensed Practice of a Trade or Profession"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 4 in the 5th line (page 1, line 8 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "\$1,000" and inserting the following: '\$200'

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 4 in the 5th line (page 1, line 8 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "\$5,000" and inserting the following: '\$2,500'

SUMMARY

This amendment decreases the minimum and maximum penalties as proposed in the bill from a minimum of \$1,000 to \$200 and a maximum of \$5,000 to \$2,500.
