1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §14203, sub-§2**, as amended by PL 2007, c. 402, Pt. HH, §3, is  
3 further amended to read:

4 **2. Exceptions.** The practice of cosmetology, barbering, aesthetics or manicuring  
5 may be carried on only by persons duly licensed to practice in this State ~~and only in an~~  
6 ~~establishment licensed by the board, except as provided in this subsection.~~ Duly licensed  
7 persons may practice their respective practices:

8 A. ~~On patients in hospitals or nursing homes;~~

9 B. ~~On residents of summer camps;~~

10 C. ~~On inmates or residents of institutions of the Department of Health and Human~~  
11 ~~Services;~~

12 D. ~~On invalids or handicapped persons in those persons' places of residence;~~

13 E. ~~On residents of nursing homes;~~

14 F. ~~On hotel or motel occupants in their hotel or motel rooms;~~

15 G. ~~On persons in their residences;~~

16 H. ~~On persons in their private businesses; and~~

17 I. ~~On human remains in licensed funeral establishments.~~

18 **SUMMARY**

19 This bill permits a cosmetologist, barber, manicurist or aesthetician licensee to  
20 perform services outside the primary business location.
