An Act To Require a Vacancy in the Office of United States Senator To Be Filled by Election

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §391, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is repealed.
3	Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §391-A is enacted to read:
4	§391-A. United States Senators
5 6 7 8	When there is a vacancy in the office of United States Senator, the Governor shall issue a proclamation declaring the vacancy and ordering a special primary followed by a special election to fill the vacancy as provided in section 366. The special election must be held within 60 days of the vacancy.
9	SUMMARY
10 11 12 13	This bill changes the way in which a United States Senator is replaced when a vacancy occurs by requiring a special election within 60 days of the vacancy. Currently, the Governor appoints a qualified person to fill the vacancy until the successor is elected and qualified. Having a special election matches the way a vacancy in the office of Representative to Congress is replaced.
