
HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 225, L.D. 285, Bill, "An Act To Amend the Laws Governing the Consolidation of School Administrative Units To Delay All Penalties for 2 Years"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 1 the following:

**Sec. 2. State pay consolidation costs.** The State shall pay the cost of consolidation by July 1, 2012 for any town or community that has complied by June 2, 2009 with the laws governing the reorganization of school administrative units.

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

Requiring the State to reimburse those towns or communities that complied with the laws governing the reorganization of school administrative units as of June 2, 2009 for the costs incurred by those towns or communities to reorganize by July 1, 2012 will result in a General Fund cost to the State in the current biennium. The amount can not be determined at this time.
