COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 228, L.D. 288, Bill, "An Act To Expand Super Pack License Opportunities"

Amend the bill by striking out all of section 1 (page 1, lines 2 to 8 in L.D.).

Amend the bill in section 2 by striking out all of the last blocked paragraph (page 1, lines 20 and 21 in L.D.).

Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 3 and 4 (page 1, lines 22 to 38 and page 2, lines 1 to 3 in L.D.).

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment removes the sections of the bill dealing with the moose lottery and the number of deer that can be taken under a super pack license. It retains the provision that reduces the number of antlerless deer permits that must be available in a wildlife management district from 5,000 available antlerless deer permits to 3,500 before a super pack license holder is eligible to obtain an antlerless deer permit.

Reducing the number of antlerless deer permits that must be available in a wildlife management district before a super pack license holder is eligible to obtain one could result in increased sales of super pack licenses resulting in minor increases in General Fund revenue not requiring any change to the budget.
