.1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §1825-B, sub-§15 is enacted to read:
3 4 5	15. Preference for small businesses. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the Director of the Bureau of General Services shall adopt rules establishing a preference percentage of up to 15% for a business:
6 7	A. With 50 or fewer employees and gross sales of less than \$5,000,000 within the most recent 12 months for which financial records are available;
8	B. Whose principal place of business is located in the State;
9	C. That pays a majority of its payroll to residents of the State; and
10 11	D. That provides health and retirement benefits to its employees as determined in subsection 11.
12 13	Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
14	SUMMARY
15 16 17 18	This bill requires the Director of the Bureau of General Services within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to adopt rules establishing a preference percentage of up to 15% for Maine small businesses bidding for state contracts. The rules are routine technical rules.
