3	Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:
4	2. Maine studies. Maine history, including the Constitution of Maine, Maine
5	geography and environment and the natural, industrial and economic resources of Maine
6	and Maine's cultural and ethnic heritage, must be taught. A required component of Maine
7	history is the study of Acadian history, which must be included in the review of content
8	standards and performance indicators of the learning results conducted in accordance
9	with section 6209, subsection 4. A required component of Maine studies is Maine Native
10	American studies, which must be included in the review of content standards and
11	performance indicators of the learning results conducted in accordance with section 6209,
12	subsection 4. The Maine Native American studies must address the following topics:
13	A. Maine tribal governments and political systems and their relationship with local,
14	state, national and international governments;
15	B. Maine Native American cultural systems and the experience of Maine tribal
16	people throughout history;
17	C. Maine Native American territories; and
18	D. Maine Native American economic systems.

20	This bill amends the law governing instruction in history in public schools to require
21	the inclusion of Acadian history as a component of Maine history.
