1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §332, sub-§5-A** is enacted to read:

3 **5-A. Multiple-town event licenses.** Notwithstanding subsections 4 and 5, the Chief
4 of the State Police may issue one license to multiple organizations eligible under this
5 section that have coordinated to conduct a game of chance event that requires the
6 participants to travel from one geographic location to another in order to play the game.
7 The fee for a license issued in accordance with this subsection may not exceed \$25.

8 **SUMMARY**

9 This bill allows for a combined license for organizations that coordinate to conduct a
10 game of chance that requires participants to travel from one location to another in order to
11 play the game, such as a poker run. The fee for such a license may not exceed \$25.
