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Sec. 1. Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Office of Licensing and Registration, Board of Dental Examiners directed to establish a new dental hygienist licensing category. Resolved: That the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Office of Licensing and Registration, Board of Dental Examiners is directed to establish a new dental hygienist licensing category that will accept alternative educational instruction programs, including qualified distance learning programs, instructional television networks and nontraditional clinical instructors, with the goal of providing students in distant locations across the State access to the training required to be a licensed dental hygienist. The Board of Dental Examiners shall establish the qualifications and scope of practice for this new licensing category, which must include 2 years of experience as a dental assistant, as well as sponsorship from a licensed Maine dentist; and be it further

13 Sec. 2. Reporting date established. Resolved: That the Board of Dental 14 Examiners shall report on its progress in establishing the new licensing category under 15 section 1, along with any proposed legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on 16 Business, Research and Economic Development by February 1, 2010. The Joint Standing 17 Committee on Business, Research and Economic Development is authorized to submit 18 legislation on this new licensing category to the Second Regular Session of the 124th 19 Legislature.

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SUMMARY

21 This resolve requires the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, 22 Office of Licensing and Registration, Board of Dental Examiners to establish a new 23 dental hygienist licensing category that will accept alternative educational instruction 24 programs, including qualified distance learning programs, instructional television 25 networks and nontraditional clinical instructors, with the goal of providing students in 26 distant locations across the State access to the training required to be a licensed dental 27 hygienist. The Board of Dental Examiners is required to establish the qualifications and 28 scope of practice for this new licensing category, which must include 2 years of 29 experience as a dental assistant as well as sponsorship from a licensed Maine dentist. This 30 resolve also requires the Board of Dental Examiners to report on its progress in 31 establishing the new licensing category to the Joint Standing Committee on Business, 32 Research and Economic Development by February 1, 2010. The joint standing 33 committee is authorized to submit legislation related to this report.
