Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §4371, as enacted by PL 2007, c. 347, §1, is amended to read:

§4371. Exemption

The provisions of this subchapter do not apply to a municipality that has adopted economic and community impact review criteria that apply to large scale retail development land use permit applications and that require a study of the comprehensive economic and community impacts of the proposed large scale retail development for consideration, among other evidence, in applying the review criteria to the application requirements for determining the economic and community impacts of a large-scale retail development on the municipality.

12 SUMMARY

This bill exempts a municipality that has adopted a review process for large-scale retail development applications that include economic and community impacts from the Informed Growth Act rather than a municipality that has adopted economic and community impact review criteria that require a study.
