An Act To Increase Judicial Salaries

(EMERGENCY)

Reported by Senator BLISS of Cumberland for the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 4, section 1701, subsection 13.

1	Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
3 4	Whereas, current salaries for members of Maine's judiciary are among the lowest in the nation; and
5 6 7 8	Whereas, the annual cost-of-living increases for judicial salaries required by law have not been implemented on a regular basis, thereby causing judicial salaries to lag behind intended salary levels recommended by the Judicial Compensation Commission in previous reports to the Legislature dating back to 1996; and
9 10	Whereas, it is the recommendation of the Judicial Compensation Commission that increases in judicial salaries become effective July 1, 2009; and
11 12 13 14	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
15	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 6. 4 MRSA §157, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1997, c. 643, Pt. M, §8, is further amended to read:

3. Deputy Chief Judge; salary. The Deputy Chief Judge of the District Court is entitled to receive a salary, for fiscal year 1998 99 <u>2009-10</u> and thereafter, of \$92,000 <u>\$125,215</u>, to be paid biweekly.

Sec. 7. 4 MRSA §157, sub-§4, ¶A, as repealed and replaced by PL 1997, c. 643, Pt. M, §9, is amended to read:

A. For fiscal year $\frac{1998-99}{2009-10}$ and thereafter, $\frac{990,000}{122,493}$, to be paid biweekly.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this
legislation takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

16 This bill, submitted by the Judicial Compensation Commission as part of its 17 December 2008 report to the Legislature, increases judicial salaries to levels that would 18 have been achieved if the recommendations made in the commission's 1996 report had 19 been fully implemented.
