The Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry may submit legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 124th Legislature pertaining to state employees' access to private lands or the dissemination of information collected on private lands; and be it further'

Amend the resolve by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

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SUMMARY

This amendment requires the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, Department of Environmental Protection, Department of Marine Resources, Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources and Department of Conservation to develop policies to guide employees when accessing private farmland and coastal lands as well as private woodland. The amendment also requires the departments to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry by January 15, 2010 on the policies developed under the resolve. The Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry may submit legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 124th Legislature.
