Sec. 1.	30-A MRSA	§2602,	sub-§3,	as amended	by PL 1991	, c. 270, §3,
further amend	led to read:					

3. Vacancy in office of selectman. When there is a vacancy in the office of
selectman, the selectmen may shall determine whether to call a town meeting to elect or
by majority vote appoint a qualified person to fill the vacancy if the vacancy occurs more
than 60 days before the regularly scheduled annual meeting of the town. If the vacancy
occurs within 60 days before the next regularly scheduled annual meeting, then the
selectmen shall provide for the vacancy to be filled by election at the town meeting.

SUMMARY

This bill amends the law to permit a board of selectmen to determine whether to fill a
vacancy on the board by appointment rather than requiring the board to call a town
meeting for that purpose if the vacancy occurs more than 60 days before the regularly
scheduled annual meeting of the town. If the vacancy occurs within 60 days of the next
annual meeting, the selectmen shall provide for the vacancy to be filled by election at the
annual meeting.
