11 12	Amend the amendment by striking out all of subsection 4 (page 1, lines 14 to 21 amendment) and inserting the following:
13 14	'4. Attorney's fees. In an appeal under subsection 1 or 2, the court may awa reasonable attorney's fees and litigation expenses either to:
15 16 17	A. The substantially prevailing plaintiff who appealed the refusal under subsection or the illegal action under subsection 2 if the court determines that the refusal illegal action was committed in bad faith; or
18 19	B. The substantially prevailing defendant if the court determines that the appeal was brought in bad faith.
20 21	Attorney's fees and litigation costs may not be awarded to or against a federal recognized Indian tribe.
22 23	This subsection applies to appeals under subsection 1 or 2 filed on or after January 2010.'
24	SUMMARY
25 26 27 28	This amendment allows a court to award attorney's fees and court costs to the body agency or official that denied the inspection or release of the public document or took a action in an executive session if that denial or action is appealed, the body, agency official prevails and the court determines that the appeal was brought in bad faith.
