Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 1 and 2 (page 1, lines 2 to 24 in L.D.)
Amend the bill in section 3 in the last line (page 2, line 2 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "within salary range 88"
Amend the bill by inserting after section 3 the following:
'Sec. 4. Application. That section of this Act that amends the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 93, first paragraph applies to a State Archivist hired after January 1, 2009.'
Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.
SUMMARY
This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, removes the sections related to compensation for the State Archivist from the bill. The salary of the State Archivist remains in range 86. The amendment also clarifies that the requirement for specific training and the ability to remove the State Archivist for cause do not affect the
