**Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

**Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §52, sub-§1**, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 737, Pt. A, §2 and Pt. C, §106 and amended by PL 1989, c. 6; c. 9, §2; and c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is further amended to read:

**1. Municipal offices.** ~~No~~ A person holding the office of county commissioner may not at the same time hold either the office of mayor or assessor of a city or the office of selectman or assessor of a town. A person holding the office of treasurer of a municipality may not at the same time hold the office of assessor of that same municipality.

**SUMMARY**

This bill prohibits a person from holding the office of treasurer and assessor at the same time for the same municipality.
