Preamble. Two thirds of both Houses of the Legislature deeming it necessary in 1 accordance with the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 14 to authorize the 2 3 issuance of bonds on behalf of the State of Maine to provide funds as described in this 4 Act, Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 5 Sec. 1. Authorization of bonds. The Treasurer of State is authorized, under the 6 7 direction of the Governor, to issue bonds in the name and on behalf of the State in an amount not exceeding \$95,510,000 for the purposes described in section 6 of this Act. 8 The bonds are a pledge of the full faith and credit of the State. The bonds may not run for 9 a period longer than 10 years from the date of the original issue of the bonds. At the 10 discretion of the Treasurer of State, with the approval of the Governor, any issuance of 11 12 bonds may contain a call feature. Sec. 2. Records of bonds issued kept by Treasurer of State. The Treasurer 13 of State shall keep an account of each bond showing the number of the bond, the name of 14 15 the successful bidder to whom sold, the amount received for the bond, the date of sale and 16 the date when payable. 17 Sec. 3. Sale; how negotiated; proceeds appropriated. The Treasurer of State may negotiate the sale of the bonds by direction of the Governor, but no bond may be 18 19 loaned, pledged or hypothecated on behalf of the State. The proceeds of the sale of the 20 bonds, which must be held by the Treasurer of State and paid by the Treasurer of State upon warrants drawn by the State Controller, are appropriated solely for the purposes set 21 22 forth in this Act. Any unencumbered balances remaining at the completion of the project 23 in this Act lapse to the debt service account established for the retirement of these bonds. 24 Sec. 4. Interest and debt retirement. The Treasurer of State shall pay interest 25 due or accruing on any bonds issued under this Act and all sums coming due for payment 26 of bonds at maturity. Sec. 5. Disbursement of bond proceeds. The proceeds of the bonds must be 27 expended as set out in this Act under the direction and supervision of the University of 28 29 Maine System. Sec. 6. Allocations from General Fund bond issue. The proceeds of the sale 30 31 of the bonds authorized under this Act must be expended as designated in the following 32 schedule. 33 UNIVERSITY OF MAINE SYSTEM 34 35 Provides funds to renovate Holmes Hall at \$4,325,000 36 the University of Maine.

Contingent upon ratification of bond issue. Sections 1 to 6 do not 10 become effective unless the people of the State ratify the issuance of the bonds as set 11 12 forth in this Act. 13 Sec. 8. Appropriation balances at year-end. At the end of each fiscal year, all 14. unencumbered appropriation balances representing state money carry forward. Bond 15 proceeds that have not been expended within 10 years after the date of the sale of the 16 bonds lapse to General Fund debt service. 17 Sec. 9. Bonds authorized but not issued. Any bonds authorized but not issued, 18 or for which bond anticipation notes are not issued within 5 years of ratification of this Act, are deauthorized and may not be issued, except that the Legislature may, within 2 19 20 years after the expiration of that 5-year period, extend the period for issuing any 21. remaining unissued bonds or bond anticipation notes for an additional amount of time not 22 to exceed 5 years. Sec. 10. Referendum for ratification; submission at election; form of 23 24 question; effective date. This Act must be submitted to the legal voters of the State at 25 a statewide election held in the month of November following passage of this Act. The 26 municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, 27 28 to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the following question: 29 "Do you favor a \$93,510,000 bond issue to modernize and improve the 30 teaching laboratories, libraries and general classrooms and perform 31 energy efficiency upgrades and repairs in the University of Maine 32 System and the Maine Community College System?" 33 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square 34 below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and 35 36 declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of 37 State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature.
