COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 706, L.D. 1031, Bill, "An Act To Protect Moose Populations and Hunting Opportunities"

Amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §11154, sub-§6, as amended by PL 2005, c. 12, Pt. III, §10, is further amended to read:

6. Application procedure. An eligible person wishing to apply for a permit must file a written application for a permit on a form furnished by the commissioner. The application fee is nonrefundable. A person may file no more than one application. A person who submits more than one application is disqualified from the selection of permittees. The application must be accompanied by an application fee of:

A. For a resident:

- (1) Seven ~~Eight~~ dollars for a one-chance application;
(2) ~~Twelve~~ Fourteen dollars for a 3-chance application. A resident must possess a valid big game hunting license to be eligible to purchase a 3-chance application; and
(3) ~~Twenty-two~~ Twenty-five dollars for a 6-chance application. A resident must possess a valid big game hunting license to be eligible to purchase a 6-chance application; or

B. For a nonresident:

- (1) ~~Fifteen~~ Eighteen dollars for a one-chance application;
(2) ~~Twenty-five~~ Twenty-nine dollars for a 3-chance application;
(3) ~~Thirty-five~~ Forty dollars for a 6-chance application; and
(4) ~~Fifty-five~~ Sixty-three dollars for a 10-chance application; multiple 10-chance options may be purchased.

The bill includes an allocation to establish the Moose Fund within the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The Fund receives money from a 15% increase in moose application fees and will be used to fund research related to moose.
