Resolve, Establishing the Blue Ribbon Commission To Study Landlord and Tenant Issues

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 1 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 2 3 Whereas, the Blue Ribbon Commission To Study Landlord and Tenant Issues is 4 created in this resolve and must issue its findings and report by December 2, 2009; and Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that 5 the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next 6 legislative session; and 7 8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 9 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 10 therefore, be it 11 That the Blue Ribbon 12 Sec. 1. Commission established. **Resolved:** Commission To Study Landlord and Tenant Issues, referred to in this resolve as "the 13 commission," is established; and be it further 14 15 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 13 members appointed as follows: 16 17 1. Six members appointed by the President of the Senate as follows: 18 A. Three members of the Senate: 19 B. One member from an organization that provides free legal services to low-income 20 persons in the State; 21 C. One member from an organization representing landlords; and 22 D. One member from an organization representing housing managers; 23 2. Six members appointed by the Speaker of the House as follows: 24 A. Four members of the House of Representatives; 25 B. One member representing the Maine State Housing Authority; and 26 C. One member representing the District Court system; and 27 3. The Attorney General or the Attorney General's designee; and be it further 28 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate 29 chair and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further 30 31 Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all 32 appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative 33 34 Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment

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of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission, which must be no later than August 1, 2009; and be it further

Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall:

1. Study the feasibility of obtaining heating fuel assistance and insulation assistance for landlords who serve low-income tenants in certain economically distressed areas;

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2. Study how to keep housing units in proper repair;

3. Study how to keep tenants in their apartments in the event of a foreclosure; and

4. Study any other issues pertaining to landlord and tenant issues that it determines to be relevant; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 2, 2009, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 124th Legislature. The Joint Standing Committee on Legal and Veterans Affairs is authorized to introduce a bill related to the subject matter of the report to the Second Regular Session of the 124th Legislature upon receipt of the report.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

This resolve establishes a blue ribbon commission to conduct a study and make recommendations on landlord and tenant issues and specifically address the feasibility of obtaining heating fuel assistance and insulation assistance for landlords who serve lowincome tenants in certain economically distressed areas, how to keep housing units in proper repair, how to keep tenants in their apartments in the event of a foreclosure and other landlord and tenant issues that the commission determines to be relevant. The commission shall make a report and recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Legal and Veterans Affairs, which is authorized to introduce a bill on this matter.

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
