13		Current law limits the amount of overtime an employee may be required to work to
14		80 hours in 2 weeks; medical interns and residents are exempt from this limitation.
15 16 17		This bill modifies the exemption to reduce the number of hours of overtime that a medical intern or resident can be required to work from 80 hours in a 2-week period to 20 hours in a one-week period and applies the same limit to physicians.
