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of Environmental Protection is not required to hold hearings or conduct other formal proceedings prior to adopting the rules amendments in accordance with subsections 1 and 2. Notwithstanding Title 38, section 610-B, last paragraph, the initial rule amendments adopted pursuant to subsection 3 are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A. After adoption of the initial rule amendments pursuant to this section, any further rule amendment adopted pursuant to this section is considered a major substantive rule and is subject to legislative review in accordance with Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

SUMMARY

 The bill amends the definition of "outdoor wood boiler." It eliminates a deadline associated with the Outdoor Wood Boiler Fund. It directs the Department of Environmental Protection to amend the department's rules regarding outdoor wood boilers by:

1. Changing the qualifications for those who may prepare an evaluation, a report and installation recommendations;

2. Amending the definition of "commercial outdoor wood boiler"; and

3. Establishing a voluntary technology-forcing particulate emission limit as an incentive to manufacturers to produce cleaner-burning units and to allow reduced setbacks for those units.
