The Secretary of State shall review the data and report on the numbers of commemorative decals listed in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A section 523, subsection 5 issued for the years 2007 and 2008 with a recommendation of a minimum usage threshold that would result in removal of a specific decal from the available list. The report must also include the cost of acquiring and distributing the decals as well as the revenue received from the issuance of the decals. The Secretary of State shall submit the report and recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation by January 1, 2010. The Joint Standing Committee on Transportation may submit a bill on the results of the report to the Second Regular Session of the 124th Legislature.
18 19 20 21	This bill adds 6 commemorative decals to the list of decals issued for veterans license plates and also requires the Secretary of State to review the 2007 and 2008 data for the number of decals issued for those years, as well as the cost of acquiring and distributing the decals along with the revenue received. The Secretary of State is to report with

the decals along with the revenue received. The Secretary of State is to report with recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation, which is authorized to submit a bill on the findings.

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
