15	'Sec. 1. Board of Licensure in Medicine to convene stakeholders to
16	develop common protocols for the use and administration of controlled
17	substances. Resolved: That the Board of Licensure in Medicine shall convene a
18	group of stakeholders, including but not limited to representatives from the State Board of
19	Nursing, the Board of Osteopathic Licensure, the Board of Dental Examiners, the Maine
20 21	Board of Pharmacy, the State Board of Veterinary Medicine and the Board of Licensure of Podiatric Medicine and the Director of the Office of Substance Abuse within the
22	Department of Health and Human Services, to develop common protocols for the use and
23	administration of controlled substances, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title
24	22, section 7246, for use by licensed prescribers. The protocol must be developed no
25	later than February 1, 2010. The Board of Licensure in Medicine shall notify the Joint
26	Standing Committee on Business, Research and Economic Development of the protocol.
27	The joint standing committee is authorized to submit legislation regarding the protocol to
28	the Second Regular Session of the 124th Legislature.'
29	SUMMARY
30	This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve that directs the Board of Licensure in
31	Medicine to convene stakeholders to develop common protocols for the use and
32	administration of controlled substances for adoption by all licensed prescribers by
33	February 1, 2010. The Joint Standing Committee on Business, Research and Economic



Development is authorized to submit legislation on the subject matter of the resolve to the Second Regular Session of the 124th Legislature.
