17 18 19 20 21	This amendment allows a municipality to review projects that are public buildings that constitute a mercantile occupancy over 3,000 square feet, hotel, motel or business occupancy of 2 or more stories rather than public buildings less than 3,000 square feet, as in the bill. This change matches the definition of "public building" in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 25, section 2448.

This bill provides for delegation of fire code permitting authority to municipalities. There will be minor Other Special Revenue Funds savings within the Department of Public Safety associated with this change. In addition, there will be a reduction in Other Special Revenue Funds revenue for the portion of plan review fees remitted to municipalities performing the review. The amount of revenue reduction cannot be determined as it is unknown how many municipalities may be delegated review authority.
