It provides that road associations' commissioners and boards, and the owners of parcels within a road association, have no civil liability to the other lot owners and lessees for the determination of the repairs and maintenance to be undertaken, the determination of assessments of materials and money, the collection of

This amendment also makes clear that the limited immunity provision does not provide immunity from enforcement actions by the Department of Environmental Protection or a municipality.
