## Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment removes the saltwater recreational fishing registry fee for residents and resident lifetime registrants and increases the fee for nonresidents from \$15 to \$21. This fee change would result in an increase in Other Special Revenue Funds revenue to the Department of Marine Resources of \$9,000 in fiscal year 2010-11.
